Hate speech is a centuries-old problem that has become a pressing concern for many societies around the world. The digitalization of our societies has accelerated the flow and spread of hate speech and provided new levers of power in digital spaces for individuals and movements that exploit feelings of frustration and anxiety to polarize societies.

Addressing hate speech and empowering an active and ethical digital generation starts with education. GCED must involve fostering global citizens equipped with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes to take informed decisions in a complex and fast changing interconnected world, deal with the increased spread of misinformation and hate speech as well as contribute to the building of just and peaceful societies.

As part of their response to the United Nations Strategy and Plan of Action on Hate Speech, UNESCO and the United Nations' Office on Genocide Prevention and the Responsibility to Protect (OSAPG) have jointly developed a guide on "Addressing hate speech through education", which presents the first policy guidance in ensuring that hate speech, online and offline, is effectively addressed and countered in and through education.

The session will provide an opportunity to understand the phenomenon of hate speech and its roots, as well as discuss recommendations on how education can prepare learners to recognize and reject hate speech and engage as socially responsible citizens online and offline.
